EU FACT SHEET 2023 physical assults







OVERVIEW

In 2023, MapMF documented a total of 602 media freedom violations in European Union Member States. 1 out of 5 of those incidents (20.6%) involved <u>physical attacks</u>, comprising 124 alerts with 178 persons related to media being attacked. Physical attacks included being pushed, <u>kicked</u>, <u>hit</u>, or even attacked with a <u>knife</u>. Physical assaults were not only carried out against journalists and media workers, but also against media <u>security</u> (3 alerts) and a <u>family member</u>.

TYPES OF ATTACKS

In 48 cases (38.7%) physical attacks led to <u>injuries</u>. In 1 out of 5 incidents (20.2%), physical attacks were accompanied by verbal assaults like intimidation, threats, insults, and abuse. Journalists even faced <u>death threats</u> in several cases while being physically attacked.

Physical attacks were also accompanied by attacks against property in 20.2% of the cases. This mainly included equipment, but also a <u>car</u> <u>being dangerously sabotaged</u> or <u>office facilities</u> <u>destroyed</u>.







CONTEXTS

Most of the physical attacks happened during protests or in <u>public places and on</u> <u>the streets</u>, such as journalists being pushed and grabbed by individuals attending far-right and anti-immigration demonstrations, attacked by police officers while reporting on protests and riots, or sexually harassed while live on air. Beside this, several cases (18) happened during <u>events</u>, such as football or basketball games or political conferences.





PERPETRATORS

Most of the physical assaults were performed by <u>private individuals</u> (70.2%, 87 alerts). A worrying amount of physical assaults were also perpetrated by <u>police and</u> <u>state security</u> (24%, 30 alerts). <u>Private security</u> was responsible for 6 physical attacks.
